# Achievements and performance


It has been an extraordinary year for all due to the Covid pandemic and the BSP activities were no exception. A summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period is given below with the flyers of the events.

A summary of the achievements of the BSP:

- The new BSP committee was elected and took charge on 16th June 2019. The committee decided to update the content and look of the BSP Glasgow website. This is now available at <a href="https://www.bspglasgow.com">https://www.bspglasgow.com</a>
- On 28<sup>th</sup> April, 2019 the **Bengali New Year** was celebrated that included a fete where Quizes, Tombola, Kid's Art Workshop and musical chair games were the highlights.
- Annual Drama 'Chittyo Binimoy' was held in Eastwood hall on 24<sup>th</sup> June, 2019. This was a home production and was well appreciated by the audience.
- In the summer of 2019, we arranged a day out for 50 members including senior members who otherwise do not get an opportunity to go to splendid Scottish countryside due to their age and infirmity. We hired a bus and went to Loch Lomond cruise that was hugely welcomed and the silver lining was freshly prepared fish and chips.
- We celebrated another successful **Durga puja** (5 days), Laxmi puja (1 day) and Kali puja (1 day) in the month of October, well organised by our Puja committee. This was followed by the BSP organising the annual Bijoya Sammelani on 3rd Nov 2019 at Clarkston hall. In this programme our members enjoyed various song, dance and drama performances from both young children and adult members. As always, we finished with an excellent dinner prepared by our our own BSP volunteers.
- The **Bijoya Sammilani** was a cultural event immediately following the Durga puja held on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2019. This was a

multicultural performance of dance, instrumentals and choir that was well received.

- **'Kali Puja' is Diwali** the festival of Light which was celebrated by the community which comes immediately following the Durga puja which means right upto Christmas the community remains busy in celebrations that send warmth in what is otherwise a cold and dreary time of the year heralding the advent of winter.
- 'Saraswati puja' is celebration of the goddess of Learning which is special to the young members of the community and just like the other events brings together the community in best spirits. There were various cultural events mainly performed by the young members of the BSP on 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2020.
- We then started planning to organise, for the first time, a BSP charity fundraising dinner at Glasgow Marriott hotel on 23rd April 2020. The aim was to raise funds in aid of 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St Margaret Hospice Scotland and Spina Bifida Scotland. Unfortunately, this event had to be cancelled at the last minute due to the COVID 19 pandemic. The committee hopes to organise this event in future once the current pandemic situation resolves. Due to the ongoing lockdown, all other BSP programmes, for the rest of the year, including our AGM had to be cancelled.














## **Financial review**

## Statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The annual loss of £776 is compensated by the reserves in the designated bank accounts. Almost all of BSP's funds are from donations, subscriptions and grants and there is no steady income from any source. However, there are no fixed expenditure like staff monthly salaries etc so the trustees can ensure there is no significant debt and the outlook for finances remain robust in the future. All future programmes and events are based on the income generated and care is taken to remain within the proposed budget for which regular financial review is carried out.

#### **Future plans**


